“Sexuality and Community”

The deadline for submission of proposals is May 17, 2024

As long as there have been intentional communities there have been groups who challenge the status quo regarding sexuality, marriage and child rearing. Intentional communities have offered with varying success an alternative to monogamy and the nuclear family whether celibate for a time like the Zoar Separatists, or for life as the Ephrata Cloister, the Shakers or the Harmonists, adopting some form of polygamy or free love like the early Latter Day Saints, Oneida, and Kerista, or some other practice in opposition to societal norms. Papers at this year’s conference could explore any of the historical or current challenges in the realm of sexuality or child rearing, offer insights into the impact these experiments had on broader societal norms, or analyze why some of these attempts failed and were abandoned.

As always, we are also interested in proposals that concern any other topic about intentional communities. **Please feel free to submit proposals on any aspect of communalism or intentional communities.**

Please include an abstract of 150 words maximum describing your presentation and/or session. Also, please include your biographical statement of 100 words maximum.
